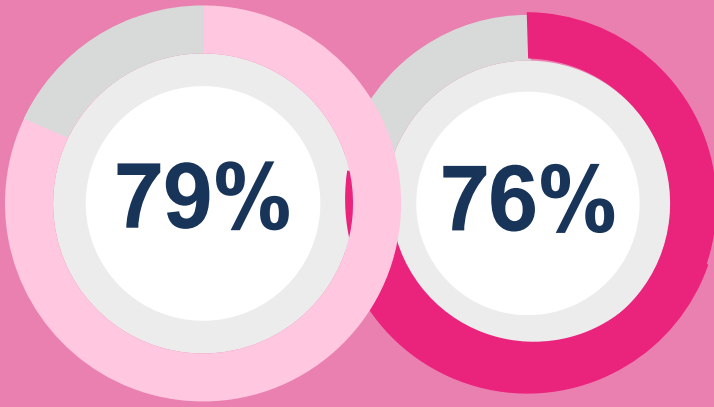

Iowa Screening Average

National Screening Average

40

From age 40 - 74, women should get a mammogram every two years if at **average** risk, or twice a year if at **above** average risk.

UNDER 50

12X

Iowa women were 12 times more likely to get a mammogram if living within 15 miles of the screening location.

OVER 50

Iowa women above 50 were 9 times more likely to get a mammogram if living within 15 miles of the screening location.

Breast cancer is the second most prevalent cancer diagnosis in Iowa.

Breast Cancer Screening Across Iowa

The highest frequency of mammograms occurred for women age 50-74.

Most women screened were white.

Most mammograms occurred in urban populations.

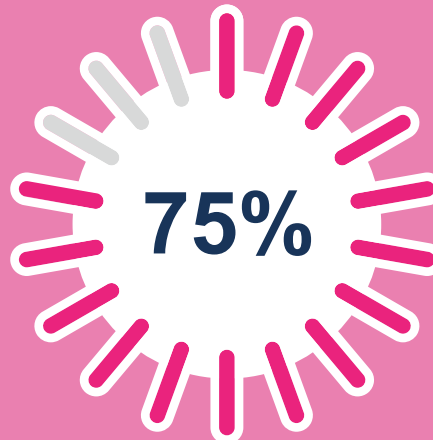
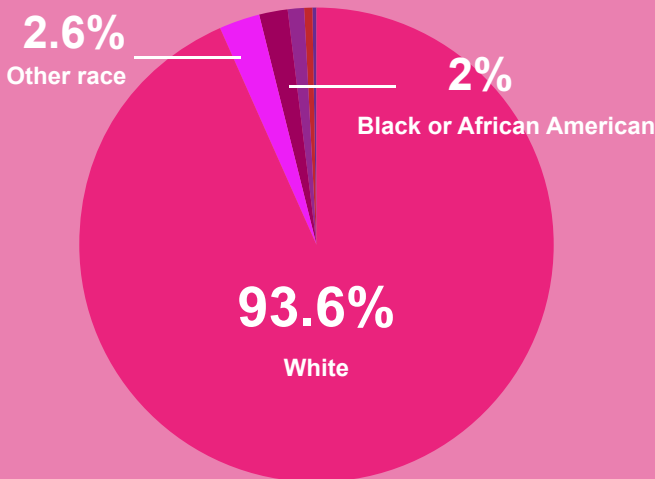

75% of women with at least one nearby facility were more likely to get mammograms. Long drive times were associated with lower frequency.
